RDUAA Small Business Programs

RDUAA has three programs designed to facilitate the inclusion of diverse firms in our business activities:

- Disadvantaged Business Enterprise
- Airport Concessions Disadvantaged Business Enterprise
- Minority and Women-Owned Small Business Program

Small Business Programs

All three programs have similar goals, objectives and criteria:

- Remove barriers which may exist for MWSBs to compete for contracts
- Eliminate any present and ongoing effects of past and present discrimination against MWSBs/ACDBEs/DBEs in opportunities awarded by the Authority
- Businesses must be small businesses owned, operated and controlled by disadvantaged, minority individuals

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program - DBE

- Required by the federal government as a condition of Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grant funding
- Applies to any procurement or contract with federal assistance (grants) – usually construction or construction-related
- Goal based on a percentage of dollars spent one "DBE" goal
- "Disadvantaged" refers to small businesses that are owned and operated by economically disadvantaged individuals that are: Black, Hispanic, Asian-Pacific, Native American, Subcontinent Asian American or Women.



Airport Concessions Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program - ACDBE

- Federal requirement, also a condition of federal funding
- Goals based on a percentage of revenues generated; one goal – ACDBE
- Applies to all concessions activities



Concessions Activities

- Food & beverage, retail operators, personal services, ATM, currency
- Management contracts, advertising businesses, electronic services
- Rental car and related services
- Businesses that provide goods or services to concessionaires
 - Suppliers, retail goods, uniform services, insurance providers

Minority and Woman-Owned Small Business - MWSB

- Required and authorized by the Board of Directors
- Applies to all of the Authority's non-federally assisted activities
 - Goods, services, construction, development activities
- Two separate goals based on the availability diverse vendors
 - Minority-owned (MB)
 - Woman-owned (WB)

How to Become Certified – ACDBE

- ACDBE Only applies to firms which perform concessions-related activities
- Extensive federal certification process, includes site visit
- Firms that wish to do business with RDUAA may apply through RDUAA Small Business
- Other firms may apply through the <u>North Carolina</u> <u>Department of Transportation</u>



How to Become Certified – DBE

- Firms <u>must</u> apply through the <u>North Carolina Department of</u> <u>Transportation</u>
- Out of state firms must be certified in home state prior to applying in North Carolina

How to Become Certified – MWSB

- Reciprocity with accepted certifications
- DBE and ACDBE firms are <u>automatically</u> eligible
 - Either minority-owned or woman-owned
- Accepted certifications include:
 - Small Business Administration: SBA 8(a) Business Development Certification – SBA 8(a)
 - Women's Business Enterprise National Council: Women Owned Small Business – WOSB

How to Become Certified – MWSB


The following certifications require **Business Size** Verification:

- N.C. Department of Administration: Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUB)
- Carolinas-Virginias Minority Supplier Development Council or any affiliate council of the National Minority Supplier Development Council (CVMSDC, NMSDC)
